• the **147.34** repeater in downtown Spokane,

• 146.88 in Spokane,

• the **444.900** repeater in the Spokane Valley,

• the **145.09** packet BBS and node North at Mt. Spokane,

• 145.010 packet node South at Krell Hill,

• the **145.43** repeater near Chewelah - was transferred to the Spokane Repeater Group,

All PL tones for the Club's repeaters are the 123.0 Hz tone, including the Chewelah repeater.

Technical Notes

Our friends at the Rowan County Amateur Radio Society in North Carolina, recently recommended a podcast by ARRL called "The Doctor Is In" which discusses all kinds of technical issues.
