What's Up in This New Year?

During our meetings in November and January VHF Club folks first talked about topics they would like to see covered during the coming year, and then voted on the most important ones to be put on the schedule.

On February 14th, Jack Tiley will cover one of the topics in our general meeting -- doing a presentation on *The* Amazing MFJ 269 Antenna Analyzer. Learn all the things you can use your MFJ antenna analyzer for in addition to measuring antenna VSWR (voltage standing wave resistance) and impedance. If you have an MFJ 269 or a newer MFJ 259 antenna analyzer there are many additional measurements that can be made. These include frequency, distance to a cable fault, coaxial cable impedance, capacitance and inductance, and much more. This will be a slide presentation with demonstrations.

Other meeting dates throughout the year include March 14, April 11 when a committee will take recommendations for the elections which will be held at our May 9 meeting, June 13, September 12, October 10 and November 14. On July 11, we will have a picnic/barbecue at Mission Park on our normal meeting night. In December, there will be no meeting but we can join KBARA for a no-host luncheon usually held on the third Saturday of December.

One of the topics people expressed interest in was Winlink/RMS Express. President Dave Carleton said that the ARES-RACES group already often covers Winlink in its 2nd Saturday workshop from 9-12 noon at the DEM Building at 1121 W. Gardner Ave. In addition, Mike Uber and now Asa Laughton while Mike is recuperating, holds a Winlink Practice Session Monday nights at 7 p.m. on the ARES repeater except for the first Monday of the month. They send information on Winlink, fill out forms and work through troubles with TNCs. Even if you just listen, you learn a lot. We discussed Field Day and talked about getting people out to available sites, such as KBARA, ARES in Liberty Lake, the DX Club, and KARS in Rathdrum. Information on Field Day will available on those club websites.

We talked about scheduling topics such as Space comms with an HT, how to do HF and other modes of SSTV (slow scan television), Raspberry Pi, a meatier version of Dave's new ham class on how to operate a radio including an HF radio, remote operating by way of the web, as well as solar activity, off grid power generation, go boxes and go kits, SDR radios, Echolink/IRLP/All Star, and FT8.

The Puyallup Hamfest is the largest in the Pacific Northwest. It takes place in early

March on the first or second Saturday. This year the **38th Amateur Radio Club Electronics Show and Swap Meet** will be held on Saturday, March 9th. It is sponsored by the Mike and Key (M&K) Amateur Radio Club.

The event occupies two floors of the The Pavilion Exhibition Hall at the Puyallup Fair and Events Center, 110 9th Avenue S.W., Puyallup, WA 98371. The hamfest is open to the general public from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. Up to 3,000 hams and non-hams attend. Admission is \$10 (under 16, are free with an adult).

There are a few commercial vendors like Ham Radio Outlet, ICOM, and DC Power (a power pole vendor). Most of the 300 tables, however, are flea market tables with just about anything you could want related to ham radio or electronics. Jack Tiley says that this is a must see for all hams at least once, but he also says to be careful. Once you go you may get hooked and go back every year. He should know. Upbeats & Updates

Board meetings are open to all club members. On months they are held, board meetings occur at 5:30 p.m. at the same location as the general meeting. In 2019, the board will meet before our general meetings in April, May, June, September and November unless something comes up and we need to add a meeting. Highlights of our board and club activity follow.

Treasurer Jake McCarty, KI7QPJ, reported that at the end of the year our account had an \$8,981.39 total, including \$5,600 in CDs. We don't have any large expenses that we are anticipating at this time. We have done a couple of smaller repairs including TNCs.

We discussed membership renewal letters to active and inactive members at the November and January board meetings. Those will add to our income as well.

Jake said he is still working on getting information about moving the operating account from Horizon Credit Union to Washington Trust for reasons of convenience. The difficulty in completing banking tasks for Hamfest is one reason among others. Jake would continue to shop for the best CD rates when the current CDs mature.

Jake and Lynn are working with the new members to get them on the email list and let them know that they have been added with a quick note.

Secretary Lynn Lambert, N7JVQ, discussed the membership renewal letter emails. Some will receive letters by mail. We will call some. Jake said that he had added a link to to Paypal in the renewal letters themselves. People can pay by check or by Paypal online. They should fill out the new membership form online, too. We will have a member information update form available online or at meetings.

President Dave Carleton, K7DSR, said that the north stack is still with Jeremiah and being worked on. It is still intermittent, sometimes working, sometimes not. The south stack was working when he checked it. The Valley UHF repeater seems to be okay.

Director Harold Hepner, AD7QJ, said that Yaesu had upgraded the software for the fusion unit and he will get this information to President Dave.

Meetings for Hamfest 2019 will begin next month. The initial seed money from our club of \$500 and \$200 for 3 radios to be donated as has been done for recent years was okayed by the board.

In November, Director and Technician Karl Shoemaker, AK2O, said he is looking at our packet equipment and the possibility of higher baud rates and higher technology. A discussion followed. Karl would like to hear from members what they would like to see.
